I spent many days backcountry skiing in the turnagin pass area, hiking near Anchorage, hunting dall sheep (with that miserable October archery only tag) and backpacking with my wife and friends. I felt that the balance struck between motorized use and non-motorized use in the Chugach was truly something special. It is a large and vast area that can, and does, provide great opportunities to both types of recreation. I don't know if my life and career will lead me back to Alaska, but if it does I hope to find the Chugach similar to how it was when I left.

In speaking with friends I was concerned about proposed changes to use of the Chugach and hope to voice my concern with losing a great balance between motorized and non-motorized use. Therefore I would like to express my support for option B with the following modifications:

1) Keep the big area near Valdez open to winter motorized access, as it is currently, and as shown on the ROS map for Alternative C.

2) Provide a winter motorized corridor from Whittier to the icefields above Blackstone and Spencer glaciers, as shown on the ROS map for Alternative C.

3) Show the existing motorized corridor from the Seward Highway up the 20 mile river on the ROS map.
