I am a trail crew member for the Selway-Bitterroot Frank Church Foundation, and have spent the bulk of my time over the past three years working along the Selway River corridor and throughout the Lochsa and Selway watersheds. I know these rivers and their tributaries like the backs of my hands, have watched them change with spring runoff and late August fires, and have invested immeasurable time and energy into ensuring that recreationists can access their favorite fishing holes, hunting meadows, or craggy overlook.

I consider myself, and the rest of my trail crews, to be responsible stewards of the streams and watersheds throughout the Nez Perce-Clearwater National Forest. We encounter many members of the public who have made the trek to spend time along Fish Creek, Colt Killed, and others in the area, specifically to recreate on or connect with these waters. We consistently hear from the public that the unique wild, pristine character of the free-flowing streams and the rugged landscape is what draws them there to fish, hunt, hike, and paddle.
