My favorite river to visit is the South Fork Salmon. That river is special for many reasons but it's lack of designation as a Wild and Scenic river opens it up to mining interest. That a river of this kind is under threat due to mining interest is of real concern. We paddlers value paddling on waters that run free and are clean. The stibnite mine proposal (Midas) is alarming. Please strongly consider precluding any mining in the headwaters of this drainage. The profits for a few are not worth the loss that many will experience if this project moves forward.
