I support the Olympic Public Access Coalition (OPAC) requests.

*Maintain 2270 (ML3) as a mainline road.

*2270 Retain Upper Loop Road (ML1 and ML2) which provide access for fire suppression. Retain ML3 as a mainline loop road.

*2270-400 Retain ML2 access to Wynoochee Pass Trail #874.

*2270-560 Leave "as is". It is a parking area with access to Discovery Lake, Mt. Hoquiam and Connie Lake.

*2270-600 Leave unchanged. It connects to the West fork Humptulips and Humpnoochee Pass.

*2298-2281 Is a mainline loop. Keep this open for emergency access, fire or dam breech.

*2270 Wet crossing (2275-100) Concerning the river bank and bridge area. This should be closed to motor vehicles and accommodated as a walk-in dispersed camping area. One ADA restroom should be budgeted at this location from May-September. Place a kiosk with Leave No Trace principles for visitor information.

*Create a safety pull out for vehicles and trailers for dispersed camping, at least 150" on roads that will be closed.

Maintain Public access.
