Also, by spreading people out, the areas are safer with my children who love to ski and ride. Turnagain pass is not a place for young kids when other areas aren't open. I am in favor of limiting the sound output of some of these modified machines. Luckily, with new technologies the sound output is decreasing.

I have also used the cabins in the winter with my young family, which wasn't possible otherwise. I'm looking forward to one day being able to access the Spencer View cabin with the family during the winter. 20 mile is another area that I've never been able to explore until I got a snowmobile. I think access corridors are a great way to keep the different groups happy and I'm disappointed to not see them in the plan. South Fork and Johnson pass are good examples of areas that very few people are able to see during the winter without a snowmachine.
