As an avid whitewater kayaker in Colorado for over a decade, I'm very familiar with the unique paddling opportunities available in the Grand Mesa, Uncompangre, and Gunnison National Forests. The quality of the paddling opportunities have brought me many times over the years to visit these regions. I was pleased to see that Oh Be Joyful creek, known to paddlers across the country for its beautiful location and uniquely high quality whitewater recreational opportunities was recognizes as eligible. In the same area, on any paddlers list are three other rivers/creeks that offer similarly outstanding paddling opportunities in stunning environments: Daisy Creek, the Slate River, and the Upper East River. In fact, almost any whitewater paddler's visit to this region involves all of these destinations. For beginning and intermediate paddlers, the Lower Taylor offers fantastic opportunities for recreation in a beautiful environment. And in the Uncompangre region, the headwaters of the San Miguel and Uncompangre offer unique adventures in a more remote feeling environment that are treasures to the Colorado paddling community.
