I support alternative D, but only with these additional improvements.

- * All 230,000 acres of wild roadless areas in the Gallatin Range should be added to the plan as Recommended Wilderness.
- * Motorized/Mechanical vehicles/activities should not be allowed in any wilderness or recommended wilderness areas.
- * No trails should be constructed in any wilderness or recommended wilderness areas where trails do not currently exist.
- * Wilderness and recommended wilderness areas should be preserved for wildlife and for wilderness quality hiking and backpacking. No mountain bikes.
- * Grazing allotments not currently used should be terminated in wilderness and recommended wilderness areas to allow the damage from grazing to heal and return to a wilderness condition.
- * In wilderness and recommended wilderness, groups should be limited to a small number of people and stock. Large numbers of stock damage the area and pollute the water with their waste. I suggest a limit of 10 people and 5 head of stock.
- * Eliminate the stocking of fish in lakes and waterways that do not naturally have fish.
- * Fish should not be stocked in wilderness areas regardless as it should be left natural.
- * How do you plan to handle human and domestic animal waste in these wilderness areas? There should be a detailed plan to prevent contamination of streams and lakes.
- * No activity should be allowed in wilderness areas that would damage the wilderness or disrupt the wildlife or humans trying to enjoy the solitude and wildness of the areas.
