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Comments: The Southern Rockies Lynx Management Direction introduces some unreasonable conditions with its specific percentages of land area which must be specially managed, but it involves 'high-probability' lynx use areas. Just setting accurate probabilities seems to require many hours of fieldwork, putting a lot of cost into a reclusive and mobile animal. Mixing probabilities with specific percentages does not make sense - some leeway should be provided. Locking up areas for 15 years (Veg S7) is not a good idea if it excludes clearing firebreaks in timber production areas. Conditions vary with time, and making the lynx a sacred 'totem animal' is an interesting 'Animal Farm' approach in which some animals are considered 'more equal than others'. One wonders what will come if and when wolves are officially re-introduced in Colorado.
