Comments: Our family has been camping, hiking, backpacking, mushroom collecting and elk-hunting in the ASNF for 32 years (hunting only recently). For a long-time our favorite "home" has been West of 8037A on Burro Mountain, almost along the wilderness boundary. Over the years we have deplored the addition of ever more drivable two-track trails in this area, and I am excited to see you clamping down on these (even if that means we will not be able to "car-camp" at our preferred place, but may have to carry our stuff in a little.

Regarding hunting -- Any sportsman should be able to carry out her/his trophy. A Friend of mine needed 12 long steep trips to get his bison out of the GC, in the ASNF the largest game are elk -- we took home 180 lbs of meat last year, that is 4 45lb backpacks, or 3 60 lbs backpacks. Any self respecting SPORTSMAN should be able to carry that for a mile or two, a few times. I totally oppose driving of marked roads (even though we have often used the "well-established tracks on Burro Mountain" that get us to almost the boundary fence). Many too many new tracks in this area in recent years. In 1990 there was only one road rossing the meadow to the fence.
