I am not in favor of the portion of the trade involving the Crazy Mountain Ranch and sections 4 and 8. I don't believe the public is receiving any benefit from that part of the trade.

Sections 4 and 8 historically have superb big game habitat, excellent trout fishing, quality access,and can provide revenue via cattle grazing and timber harvest. Sections 11, 13, and 21 offer nothing in comparison. They're nothing but sections of rock that have lakes with no sustainable, reproducing trout populations. Also, with how difficult these lake are too access by just hiking the amount of public use they would get would be far less than sections 4 and 8.

Furthermore, the re-routing of trail 272 would cost tax payers money. CMR has agreed to donate \$75,000 to the trails re-route cost. Estimates of that at \$15,000 a mile are far exceeding the \$75,000 mark.
