An example is the Brush Creek trail which was a very popular trail. This trail was abandoned after the B&B fire. I attended two meeting at the Sisters R.S. several years ago about abandoned trails. There was very strong support for keeping the Brush Creek trail open. This is the shortest trail to the Pacific Crest Trail and to Rockpile Lake. The forest service promised to maintain it. They never did.
