These fees would have kept us out. As it was, we succeeded in raising kids who appreciate and know how to behave in the wilderness.

I really feel that the Willamette Forest needs to make sure that low income folks are not locked out of the wilderness. According to the presenters at the open house I attended, yur proposed solution is to partner with non-profits and libraries. However, many low income families are not served by these groups. A much more fair option might be for families who qualify for Earned Income tax credit to be able to apply for an annual fee exemption card.

I really worry that access to wilderness, National Parks, and public lands in general will become limited to well-off folks, and that there might be a hidden agenda to keep the low income "losers" and "people who don't look like us" out. (Given the current administration, this is not an outlandish paranoid idea.)
