In broad terms, my wife and I fully support all projects that improve our watersheds and forests to maximize the carry capacity for our fish and wildlife. We are also fully supportive of any recreation improvements that will benefit the locals and the tourism industry. We are very supportive of local jobs and local industries but not if the renewable resources, specifically our fish and wildlife will suffer consequences as a result of the industry. For example the logging industry, specifically clearcutting and road building has a very real, long term, negative impact on healthy watersheds, healthy forests and the tourism industries. We are much more receptive to helicopter logging operations that don't scar the land, cause landslides, increase sediment loads in the streams, and ruin the visual appeal for of the land.

Specific projects we fully endorse are the trail improvements at Canoe Point, 12 mile cabin improvements, invasive weed mitigation, the Sarkar Cove access project for kayaking/canoeing and the El Capitan campground/boat launch/restroom improvements and ALL the stream restoration projects.

We fully endorse any and all stream restoration projects. The Harris,12 mile and other streams have benefited greatly from what has been done. Great job!

We are strongly opposed to harvesting anymore of our precious old growth forests that provide invaluable winter range habitat for our deer herds.
