Comments: I am writing to strongly object to changing Forest Service rules to allow the Jordon Cove Project pipeline that is proposed to travel through 30 miles of State land. The rules you have in place have been created for a reason. To protect our forestlands and watersheds for the people of Oregon. That is your mandate. Construction of this pipeline will adversely effect our rivers. Heavy equipment, cutting back of trees that shade and cool our rivers, major disruption of river beds will impact both water quality and fish populations.
