I am writing to ask you to stop the Foothills Landscape Project.

Our natural resources are vitally important and we must conserve them. I am particularly worried about the building of unnecessary roads, which fractures habitat for our precious native wildlife, and about herbicide application.

Herbicides and other pesticides pollute the water that we drink, and they have cascading effects on our wildlife. Overuse of herbicides and other forms of habitat loss are pushing species to the brink -- including so many creatures we take for granted like bees, butterflies, and songbirds. Please let me know how this plan incorporates protection of these resources so that while we are enjoying our natural world and taking advantage of its resources, we are not also creating a poisoned wasteland for our children and grandchildren.
