Now we are coming to understand that the health of the earth must be our paramount concern. Likewise, uncontrolled recreational use of publicly owned natural areas is not a birthright. It is important to get people out into nature, but only activities compatible with preserving and enhancing the flora and fauna of nature should be tolerated in the areas, like the Foothills, that are needed for climate protection. The ability to penetrate natural areas in a car and on paved roads is not the birthright of every American. The Forest Service needs to allow for public opinion and oversight while also developing science-based information on combating climate change in all its endeavors.
