In turn, this time spent in nature, away from the detrimental distractions of modern life and devices, helps us to settle troubled, young minds, and the peace that this brings transcends the moment and permeates all areas of our members' lives and relationships. Further, these activities, which occur almost exclusively in our National Forests, are invaluable in our efforts to aid our young members in building the self-confidence needed to face the struggles that their various diagnoses inevitably present.

Our program has been located in Rabun County since 2012 and has success stories beyond listing. The thought that some of the areas that we hold dear for the work that we do with these largely forgotten children could become victim to the devastation of clear-cutting and other unnecessary exploitation is truly tragic. The fact that it is even being considered is, frankly, unconscionable.
