First, thanks. Thanks for the work and the enormous effort, yours and your staff's, that have gone into the draft Foothills Environmental Assessment. I am genuinely excited by a number of the ideas discussed, including the carve-out for stands of old-growth trees.

But I must finally oppose a core tenet of the plan: that any long-term, far-reaching EA can replace the site-specific planning review that NEPA has provided for decades now.

Here's the analogy that struck me early in the public process and remains with me today:

Would I, if I were owner of a tract of forested land, agree to a years-long management plan for that land if the supervising forester could not tell me exactly when and where he/she intended to apply culling, thinning, fire, herbicide spraying, road building, and clearing of rights of way? The honest answer is "no."

That's the crux for me.
