These are public lands. You take care of these lands with public money. As a citizen, and funder of your work, I have every right to know what you propose with a detailed analysis of the science behind what you're planning to do. You have a responsibility to be a good steward of our public lands, and the public has a right to participate in decisions about the care of this land.

Furthermore, as a public agency, I would expect you to want to transparently engage with all stakeholders in your planning processes, lest you become embroiled in some type of corruption in which the public good is not served. Government provides services for its citizenry. Good democratic governance demands transparent engagement with all stakeholders, to ensure that the citizen's wishes about their lands are being fulfilled.

I am also concerned about your undisclosed plans to use herbicides.
