Comments: I support the "NO ACTION ALTERNATIVE" with the following changes: Hoodoo area will be designated as 'semi-primitive motorized' instead of a RWA. Access would be limited to snowmobiles, snow bikes and Mtn bikes.

North Fork Spruce-White Sands and Sneakfoot Meadows RWA's will be eliminated.

I don't support an RWA designation but do support protection of the Great Burn from any activity(s) that could impair the character of the area. Areas noted for RWA expansion in alternatives 'W' and 'Z' do not meet the criteria for Recommended Wilderness.

I would honestly prefer there was no RWA at all due to the loss of management that happens when you designate an RWA. Why would the Forest Service elect to lose the ability to manage their area for fire and recreational benefit of the public which we have turned over to you.

I ride the Hoo Doo area out of superior a couple of times a year on snowmobiles and in all the trips I have taken in the area I have never seen any wildlife other than an occasional deer or moose near the parking lot at the old mine.
