None of the alternatives presented reflect the management I would like to see implemented for the Hoodoo Roadless Area. Please accept these comments into the formal record.

The proposed great burn wilderness area has been a retreat for myself and a number of my friends and family for a long time. Matter in fact my grand father has be recreating in the great burn for over 60 years. It is imperative to keep this area wild. Wilderness areas have proven to positively impact local communities, clean water and clean air. It is our responsibility as the care takers of our land to conserve and preserve wild places for future generations.

Last summer I hiked into cedar log lake with 4 of my best friends. The lake was wild and full of native cutthroat trout.
