What a disappointment to my clients, that thought they were getting a wild experience, to stumble upon a machine part. Also allowing machines in that mountain goat high country just for the pleasure of a few doesn't make any sense. Please keep motors out of the Great Burn. Please keep it as recommended Wilderness. Thank you.

The highlight of almost all my clients experiences was seeing mountain goats perched on a shear mountain wall. I can't believe we would jepordize these iconic animals just for the short term thrill of a few.

Please continue to manage the entire Hoodo Roadless Area as Recommended Wilderness.
