I am a avid outdoors person and horse and mule packer. I have packed trail crews in and out this area. I believe the impact that snowmobiles would have in this area would be harm full to the environment and animals in that area. I have seen 1st hand the remains of snowmobile parts left over in areas like this. I have packed out left over parts, i.e. belts, gas cans, some removable cowling or damaged ski parts. I also believe the noise and traffic would be detrimental to the health and wellness of the animals who rely on the feed and browse in that are for winter subsistence.
