Comments: As an American citizen and taxpayer, I am outraged over your proposal to remove most of the federally-protected wild horses from the Apache Sitgreaves National Forest. You said that you have set aside 19,700 acres for the wild horses to roam around on. How many acres have you set aside for livestock grazing? Your plan limits the horses' range to 21 square miles. The surrounding Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest covers more than 43 thousand square miles of public land. Your policy of removing horses to maximize private livestock grazing on public lands comes at a high price to American taxpayers, who are funding the cruel roundup programs, and to the wild horses, who pay with their families, their freedom and their lives. The horses being captured are healthy and fit - they are not starving as some western politicians and ranchers claim.
