Comments: I have recently reviewed the released Nez Perce-Clearwater Forest Plan Revision Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Draft Revised Forest Plan. None of the alternatives presented reflect the management I would like to see implemented for the Hoodoo Roadless Area. Please accept these comments into the formal record.

I've lived in this area most of my life and with our booming population growth and many moving to this area to get away from the crowds, these wild place are more valuable all the time. The Great Burn has been recommended for wilderness and is one of the largest roadless areas in the lower 48. The habitat for wildlife is VIP. Mountain goats have been pushed and pushed and are now at the highest reaches of their habitat. Snowmobiles would be a significant danger for these goats. The Idaho side of the Great Burn should remain Recommended Wilderness. Wolverines are also endangered and this area provided great habitat for them.
