Comments: The Forest Service (USFS) is preparing a population management plan for the Heber wild horses, who live in the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest, about 110 miles north-east of Phoenix. USFS allows the annual equivalent of hundreds of cows to graze in the Heber Wild Horse Territory, yet you want to restrict the number of wild horses to 50 to 101. You also plan to roundup all horses outside of the Territory, estimated to be in the hundreds.

Please give the Heber wild horses their fair share! At minimum 50% of forage should be dedicated to wild horses in this Congressionally-designated wild horse habitat. They are suppose to be protected by the 1971 WILD FREE ROAMING HORSE AND BURROW ACT, yet this law is constantly violated.
