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Comments: The U.S. Forest Service is revising the 20-year plan that guides how the government will manage the Tonto National Forest. This plan will decide how all aspects of the Tonto's 2.8 million acres of forests, deserts, rivers, lakes and recreation areas will be managed for decades to come.

The Tonto National Forest is home to 19 threatened and endangered species, and 50 species of conservation concern. Of course, the Forest Service under the Trump administration favors grazing, mining, logging and motorized wreckreation to the detriment of numerous fish and wildlife species. Inventoried Roadless Areas and even the few places recommended for wilderness protection will be vulnerable to off-road vehicles.

Forest Service needs to grant the Tonto the strongest protections possible.
