Comments: There should be no defined boundary fence for Heber Territory. Horses can continue to move in and out of Heber Territory onto adjacent US forest lands and also BMRD. Horses were on BMRD prior to the 1971 law and should still be allowed to use this area. Forest service should have to prove horses are excess before removing them. It is illegal to set a number of 104 horses and it is not in compliance of what is excess.
