Comments: This message is in regard to the Heber Wild Horse Territory, just one of many of our wild horse herds that have been mismanaged by the BLM and US Forest Service lands. There should be no defining boundary fence for the Heber Territory. Horses can continue to ingress and egress from the boundaries of the Heber Territory onto adjacent US Forest Service lands on the Black Mesa Ranger District (BMRD). Horses were on the BMRD prior to 1971 and should be able to continue to use this area.

The Forestry Service cannot remove any wild horses until they are proven "excess" by law.

Managing by setting a number of 104 horses is illegal and not in compliance with the definition of "excess".

Forestry Service cannot set arbitrary numbers of horses in the territory.

I do not support as well as many others do not support giving birth control (PSP), We request that the law be followed by supporting the phrase in the law, management should be "minimal feasible management." PZP is an endocrine disrupter and causes permanent sterility within four years and not seven as stated by the producers of the "PZP" drug. This is intrusive management which is not in compliance with the law.
