Horses do not destroy the land - cattle do. livestock graze on public land at taxpayers expense. Privately owned cattle and sheep are allocated 82% of forage compared to 18% for legally protected horses.

The Heber horse population has remained consistent from 2005 to present according to the Forest Service. This is without culls.
