Comments: I have recently reviewed the released Nez Perce-Clearwater Forest Plan Revision Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Draft Revised Forest Plan. None of the alternatives presented reflect the management I would like to see implemented for the Hoodoo Roadless Area. Please accept these comments into the formal record.

As a long time resident of Montana it concerns me that current Forest Service policies and practices continue to infringe on and remove wilderness areas across the nation. It is not in the long term interest of this country or the citizens of the state of Montana for this practice to continue. Wilderness areas were set to protect the wildlife that exists in this area and this protection needs to be defended.

Although it has been years since I have been in this area, its natural untouched beauty left an indelible mark on me. This pristine wilderness area needs to be left remaining as it is.

The entire Hoodoo Roadless area needs to remain intact and continue to be managed as Recommended Wilderness.

Roadless Area designation is worthless if motorized vehicles are allowed to be operated in winter. The disruption to the normal cycles of nature are interrupted, usually with devastating impacts that cannot be reversed.

I do not have intimate knowledge of these two surface waters, however naming them as Wild and Scenic will protect them from future degradation.
