Comments: Even though I am not a citizen of Idaho, these public lands belong to all Americans. I am very concerned about the future of these wildlands especially as they pertain to the last remaining wild areas and the potential for preserving wildlife corridors. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Nez Perce-Clearwater National Forests Draft Revised Forest Plan and Draft Environmental Impact Statement. I do care about the future of Idahos public lands and wildlife, as I do across all public lands of this country. I have been fortunate to have visited many wild places and lands and it is very important to me the Forest Service responsibly balance conservation and other uses of the forest.

Im very disappointed to learn that some of the alternatives under consideration would remove wilderness protections from the Great Burn area (i.e., the Hoodoo Recommended Wilderness). The Idaho Department of Fish and Game has observed that illegal snowmobiling and snow biking may be negatively affecting the forests mountain goat populations. To safeguard this iconic Idaho species, the Great Burn should continue to be managed as wilderness. All lands that have wilderness characteristic should be designated as such and managed as such.

To retain valuable wildlife habitat and connectivity, the Mallard-Larkins and Meadow Creek areas should also be recommended and managed as wilderness. The Mallard-Larkins area provides outstanding opportunities for primitive recreation, and the Meadow Creek area supports an incredible diversity of fish species and wildlife.
