I have hiked the Great Burn (Hoodo Roadless Area) for at least 25 years. It is a place of great beauty, has excellent fishing, camping and is a good place for hiking with solitude. This area should be recommended for wilderness protection and no motorized access allowed. There are thousands of acres around that are available for motorized recreation. This area is not needed to be released for motorized use! Please protect it for the future. My family when our kids were little used this area along the State Line trail to backpack into the lakes along the boarder. These were of the distance that we could lake hop and our kids could handle the distances. As they grew older we were able to return and they shared their memories.
