None of the alternatives presented reflect the management I would like to see implemented for the Hoodoo Roadless Area. Please accept these comments into the formal record.

I have lived in Montana for most of my life and am an avid hiker. I love our roadless areas and am well aware of how much they are beloved not only by Montanans but also by people everywhere who want to find serene wild places. Please keep the Hoodoo Roadless Area, the Great Burn area, roadless for future generations. Though I have not visited this area to date, I hope to visit and hike there in the coming years.

I would like to see 151,874 acres protected based on the recommendation by Montana Wilderness Association, a group that has a history of working with those familiar with this and other areas, who have significant on the ground experience.

In terms of winter management, please keep this area non-motorized for the sake of wildlife and back-country skiing. Motorized activity is disruptive to both.

Additionally, I agree with MWA's recommendation to recognize Cayuse Creek and Kelly Creek with all of its forks.

Montana is renowned for its wild acres, its roadless lands, wilderness and parks. They bring in tourist dollars and will be available for our children and grandchildren. Please do not encroach on these special places.
