The Medicine Bow Landscape and Vegetation Analysis Project on the Medicine Bow National Forest in the Snowy Range and Sierra Madre of southeastern Wyoming would allow:

95,000 acres to be clear cut (logging all trees, dead and alive)

165,000 acres to be selectively cut

600 miles of new temporary roads to be built

More than 50% of inventoried roadless areas to be logged and "treated", using chain saws, mechanical equipment, and skid trails

All of this would be done without any environmental analysis of specific projects. The Forest Service won't tell us where clear cuts would be located, where roads would be built, or what the impacts of those activities would be on wildlife, recreation, or other natural values.

We've already suffered beetle, wild fires and reduced tree areas. To allow the clear cutting, miles of logging roads and harm to wild life habitats is unconscionable!
