The town of Glacier and the greater Bellingham area depend upon a recreation economy, which is directly dependent upon these forested areas remaining as they are. I am opposed to improving or creating new roads specifically to support the transport of heavy equipment related to timber harvest, and am opposed to the creation of temporary road structure to support said equipment.
