Comments: I'm horrified that the Forest Service is planning to sell part of the Tongass National Forest for logging! Please immediately cancel the sale for the following three reasons:

- 1. Doing so supports the Forest Service's stated mission to "sustain forests and grasslands for present and future generations" (https://www.fs.usda.gov/about-agency).
- 2. By sparing these trees, you'll permit them to continue drawing carbon out of the oversaturated atmosphere a task we desperately need them to perform during the climate crisis.
- 3. It's the right thing to do. If a group of humans had been targeted for extermination as brutally and successfully as old-growth forest, we would call it genocide. Clear-cutting more than 5,100 acres of old-growth forest is ecocide. Not only will the logging company kill those trees, they'll destroy the ecosystem that depends on the trees.
