Comments: The Tongass is the largest intact temperate rainforest left on Earth and provides vital habitat for eagles, bears, wolves, salmon and countless other species. It is a globally recognized carbon sink and helps to mitigate the worst impacts of climate change, storing approximately 8% of the total carbon stored in all national forests.

Logging the Tongass has been tremendously costly for taxpayers. A new report estimates that timber sales from the forest have cost taxpayers \$1.7 billion over four decades.

I believe that we need to move away from unsustainable old-growth timber sales. More clearcutting will damage the real drivers of southeast Alaska's economy: fish, wildlife and tourism. Defenders won't stand by and watch as the administration despoils irreplaceable wildlife habitat and threatens sustainable jobs and livelihoods in southeast Alaska.

I oppose all intents to increase clear-cutting in the Tongass National Forest.

This project and the proposed elimination of the Roadless Area Conservation Rule on the Tongass are part of a mistaken policy which is against the true value of the forest and will negatively impact salmon in the area.
