Sound familiar? It does to me. I do not live in Idaho and I have never had the opportunity to visit the South Fork of the Salmon and if this mine is put in, I will never be able to. You, the forest service, sit as the gatekeeper to the critical junction. Right now we are seeing the real effects of climate change, deforestation, and lack of forest management in California and the effects of warming sea levels in the Gulf of Mexico. The decisions we make as a nation right now will determine our path forward for the future.

Indigenous knowledge is an essential to tackling climate change.
