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Comments: Table 146 on page 638 of Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Coconino National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan, Volume 2 states that under Alternatives B,C, and D the acres managed for natural-appearing scenery are 99% of forest. Page 600 of the same volume states "Wilderness areas around Sedona are regularly impacted by aerial tours whose low altitude and noise disrupt wilderness character through the sights and sounds of human presence". Page 638 of the same volume states "Research has shown that high-quality scenery , especially that related to natural-appearing forests, enhances people's lives and benefits society" and "This research indicates that people value most highly the more visually attractive and natural-appearing landscapes". Your analysis has not adequately addressed the negative impacts of helicopters for air tours in your affected environment. Helicopters are not part of the "natural-appearing scenery" on the Coconino National Forest and should be considered a negative impact on visitors, their experience, and on wildlife resources. Please provide an analysis of helicopter use in wilderness areas and below the Mogollon Rim in the Sedona Oak Creek area.
