I have proposed and have over seen the construction of trails and trail systems for the city of Medford, Oregon,, city of Jacksonville, Rogue Siskiyou National Forest and the Medford District BLM. I have attended many public meetings and participated in several recreation boards as well as conflict resolution committee's regarding trail access.
