Comments: I want to add my voice to the many other who are supporting Midas Gold's Stibnite Gold Project. Midas Gold's modified Plan of Restoration Operations (PRO) illustrates the company's vision for safely mining critical minerals while providing Idahoans with well-paying jobs, and much needed income. Midas Gold's 2014 Pre-Feasibility Study identified that the Stibnite Gold Project can produce at least 4 million ounces of gold and 100 million pounds of antimony. Both gold and antimony are critical resources needed by many industries around the world including the technology sector, green energy production, and the refining of petroleum, among many other uses. Currently, the United States is completely dependent on imports to meet its antimony needs, however, the Stibnite Gold Project can become a prime resource for American industries.

In addition to adding to our domestic mining industry, during the construction of the mine, the project will employ an estimated 600 to 700 people, with payroll expenditures totaling between \$42 million and \$49 million.
