Comments: In response to a new comment period on the Tongass National Forest Logging project, I ask again that it be denied! My reasons are the following: unique species "like none other" and a region interconnected to river streams and the ocean. It is an extremely sensitive region! If the salmon are interrupted it will influence species such as salmon sharks just outside the fresh water streams in the ocean. In addition, it is home to rare coastal wolves that spend some time in ocean shore dwelling. It is a unique behavior, a unique subspecies but also related to some of the oldest wolf species on the planet. Likewise, the Tongass is home to the blue morph black bear and unique grouse that has a more limited range than some. There are areas where "Arctic" species come 'at times', as well as a forest that can fix carbon to offset "some" gas consumption and carbon better than most forested areas.
