Stormy weather will challenge skiers not familiar with the terrain. Lost skiers below the boundary are liable to occur. During clear sunny weather snow quality will be questionable, leading to possible skier injuries.

The new Crazy Horse lift will crowd slopes already serviced by Dream Catcher, I'm not in favor. One of the highlights of Skiing Targhee for locals and visitors is how skiers are dispersed from the top of Fred's Mt. Having uncrowded slopes is a delight in today's world! Let's keep the Ghee Charm alive!

The other new lifts planned- Peaked, Mono trees, North Boundary will be a positive addition. They will help spread skiers out and provide sheltered skiing during stormy weather.
