Comments: I am grateful for this opportunity to convey my support for Midas Gold Idaho's proposed Stibnite Gold Project. I urge you to approve its permit application. From the moment they first expressed interest in the Stibnite mining district, Midas Gold has gone to great lengths to listen and collaborate with the community. They have worked hard to make sure that we as local residents, are an important part of the process to make the Stibnite Gold Project a reality. I know that, for some time, Midas Gold has spent millions of dollars studying the historic Stibnite mining district and has consulted the community every step of the way as it hones the project's proposal.
