Comments: I am adamantly opposed to allowing ebikes onto mountain bike trails for numerous reasons.

- 1. Once a trail becomes officially designated motorized, maintenance funds we've typically relied upon are no longer available.
- 2. Any time access is proposed on a multi-use trail, hikers and equestrians lose a non-motorized trail and their funding sources too!
- 3. It doesn't align with the new rule that the Department of Interior agencies recently adopted, adding to consumer confusion on where eMTBs can go.
- 4. Locally, eMTB access on Forest Service trails would not align with Washington state law, which classifies e-bikes as non-motorized.
- 5. From my personal experience individuals on ebikes generally do not have much experience biking and are less likely to wear helmets and protective gear. Furthermore, I have witness several individuals on ebikes that are unaware of the rules of the road or trail, which would create dangerous situations for other non-motorized users. Sincerely,
