I support managing eMTBs differently from traditional mountain bikes for the following reasons:

- * Separating objectives would allow for a non- motorized designation for Class 1 e-bikes which I support.
- * Separating objectives would allow for a motorized designation for Class 2 and 3 e-bikes which I support. Class 2 and 3 should be specifically prohibited from non-motorized trails and only pedal assist eMTBs under 750 watts that cannot be self-propelled should be under consideration for non-motorized trail access. These Class 1 e-bikes will be treated exactly as all other designated mountain bikes with no restrictions.
- * I do not believe that Class 1 eMTBs require a new class under MVUM. I strongly urge the USFS to manage Class 1 e-bikes as a new non-motorized user group, to avoiid jeopardizing existing non-motorized trail status designations.
- * The three class system is being adopted in states though out the U.S and 27 states have now adopted them as non-motorized bicycles. Adopting this same classification by the USFS helps to create consistency between federal land management agencies as well as increasingly more states legislative initiatives, ultimately helping to reduce consumer conflict and create a consistent management objective for eMTBs on the trail.
