This is an important project for Valley County and will have a significant impact on the community. As someone who has lived & project in the Yellow Pine area (and other Idaho wilderness areas) since 1971 (I graduated high school in Yellow Pine in 1973) I want to make sure the Stibnite Gold Project is done the right way.

In the time passing since the early '70s I've seen many things change in the Idaho Wilderness. Some good, most not so good. The recurring theme that keeps coming up is there is no money for forest roads. No money for forest roads is what is always said to be the reason for road closures. With that thought in mind why would we want to make another new road in a roadless area?

There already is a road from Landmark to Stibnite via Yellow Pine. It can be upgraded to serve Midas's purpose. This will cost a significant amount of capital.
