The South Fork of the Salmon River is a place I hope to enjoy and share with others for a lifetime. I am writing to you today because I am concerned about the future of the South Salmon. I recently heard about the Stibnite Gold Project and wanted to share my concerns and hope to hear more about what is being done to ensure the protection of this special place. Having seen the impact of mines before, I want to ensure that this project is well thought through before it is considered. Today more than ever we have seen the devastating impacts mines can have on sacred areas: rises in stream temperatures for several endangered or threatened species of fish, chemical pollution and bank erosion to name a few. Also, as I develop my understanding of land rights, I believe this is on Public Land that is sacred to the Nez Perce and want to ensure that this has been approved.

I request to please extend the commenting period to the full 120 days in regards to the Midas Mine on the South Fork White Salmon.
