Given the scale of this proposed operation, it seems sensible to provide more opportunities for public engagement. I am also concerned about the removal of large trees, which deviates from forest service protocol. I think that this project needs far more public exposure so that citizens can voice their opinion. The valley belongs to everyone, and a proposal of this scale should not be passed without extensive consideration and far more public input.
